

Notice the Difference Between Evidence and Repetition Online



Seeing the same statement several times online can make it feel more convincing. However, repeated information is not necessarily independent evidence. Several comments may discuss similar experiences, while others may simply repeat information already circulating elsewhere.

Students evaluating academic assistance platforms should therefore consider whether feedback appears to originate from separate experiences. They can look at the level of detail provided, whether reviewers describe their own interactions, and whether the information adds something new rather than repeating an existing claim.

Transparency is easier to evaluate when information can be checked directly, while support responsiveness can be considered through independently described experiences. If several accounts appear similar, readers can investigate whether they provide separate observations or merely echo the same idea.

The number of times an idea appears online is only one part of its usefulness. What matters more is whether the information comes from meaningful experiences and can withstand reasonable checking.

Students who distinguish genuine repetition from independent observations can evaluate online feedback more carefully and make academic decisions with a clearer understanding of the evidence available.
